Sub: Appointment by promotion of officers from Punjab Police Service to the Punjab Cadre of Indian Police Service from the Select List of the year 2013.

Sir,

I am directed to refer to State Government's letter no.1/22/2012-2H(I)/734 dated 20.02.2014 on the subject cited above and to say that the authorized promotion quota of Punjab Cadre of IPS as on 01.01.2014 was 52 whereas 47 promotee IPS officers are in position on the due date. Out of the 5 vacancies thus available, one is a carried forward vacancy from the Select List of 2010 while 4 vacancies have arisen in the year 2013 due to retirement of 4 promotee officers.

2. Therefore, in terms of the provisions contained in the IPS (Recruitment) Rules, 1954 read with IPS (Appointment by Promotion) Regulations, 1955, it has been decided that appointment by promotion from Punjab Police Service to the Indian Police Service may be made by preparing the Select List of the year <u>2013</u> upto <u>5 vacancies</u> in all.
